Course Description

This course offers an introduction to the Swedish language together with hands-on experiential learning activities such as role-plays, quizzes, out-of-classroom activities and Swedish language partners. Students that have no previous knowledge of Swedish will learn basic vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation in order to be able to do grocery shopping, order at a café, conduct small talk with Swedes, etc. The course also focuses on teaching students culture-specific vocabulary and concepts in order to improve understanding of Swedish culture. This course is an introductory course only and will not replace level 1 taught at Pitt.

Learning Objectives

By the end of the course, students will have:

- acquired basic Swedish language skills that enable them to get by in daily life situations
- gained knowledge about Swedish, and specifically, Uppsala student life through the learning of culture-specific vocabulary
- had the ability to actively practice language learning through extensive experiential learning activities

Course Prerequisites

None.

Methods of Instruction

Learning will involve theoretical classroom sessions and active experiential learning sessions, which are designed to be very connected. Classroom sessions will focus on teaching students basic pronunciation, grammar and vocabulary. The out of classroom experiential learning sessions will involve active learning – students will be forced to apply the theoretical knowledge they learned in class through site visits to e.g. cafés, the supermarket or the nations; activities with Swedish language partners and cultural activities such as picnics, nation and café visits.

Assessment and Final Grade

Grading will be based on the following:

1. Attendance and Participation: 50 %

2. Homework and quizzes: 25 %

3. Final Written Exam: 15 %

4. Final Oral Exam: 10 %

Course Requirements

Attendance and class participation

Since this course heavily focuses on applying theoretical knowledge actively, attendance and class participation are the most important part of the course. This is why attendance and class participation will be 50 % of the final grade. Should students fail to attend or not to actively participate in the experiential learning activities, the grade will be heavily affected.

Homework

Students are expected to complete homework assignments on their own and with their Swedish language partners. These assignments should be handed in at the beginning of each class. Students will also be required to take 3 quizzes to show they have learned their homework. Homework assignments and quizzes count for 25 % of the final grade.

Exams

At the end of the course, there will be a final exam which counts for 15 % of the final grade. The exam will focus on the theoretical parts of the course (grammar and vocabulary). There will also be an oral exam counting for 10 % of the final grade.
